Visa Application

Step 1: Check if you require a Visa to visit Canada. Please visit the website <u>here</u> (<u>http://www.cic.gc.ca/</u><u>english/visit/visas-tool.asp?</u>)

Step 2: If you require a Visa, please email <u>ir@taekwondo-canada.com</u> for an invitation letter from Taekwondo Canada as a supporting document

Step 3: Please note Canada does not have a Visa Office in every country so it is important that delegates visit the website of the Canadian <u>Visa Office</u> responsible for processing their Visa application. Information is available on the website for how to submit a Visa application and the documentation required.

<u>Processing times for Visa applications</u> vary depending on the Visa office and the time of the year. Participants are encouraged to apply approximately **12 weeks** in advance of their departure date to ensure they receive the Visa in time.

Travel Information

Vancouver International Airport (YVR) is located approximately 16km (about 25 min drive) from the host venue/hotel – Hilton Vancouver Metrotown Hotel (6083 McKay Ave, Burnaby, BC, V5H 2W7)

CENTRAL PARK

This 86.4-hectare urban park is notable for its immense douglas fir, western hemlock, cedar, poplar and maple groves. Central Park is known for its excellent sports and recreation facilities. CAPILANO SUSPENSION BRIDGE

Breathtakingly suspended 230 feet above and 450 feet across Capilano River, Capilano Suspension Bridge takes you to towering evergreens, serene trails and our award winning attraction, Treetops Adventure.
