OVERVIEW: 2025 FISU SUMMER WORLD UNIVERSITY GAMES

Tour(s) Dates:	To be determined (TBD) based on published competition calendar.
Competition Dates:	Games dates are July 16 th to July 27 th , 2025. Competition dates for taekwondo are TBD.
Location:	Rhine-Ruhr, Germany
Kyorugi Team Size:	Maximum of sixteen (16) athletes, one (1) athlete per World Taekwondo World weight class. Each athlete may compete in both Kyorugi and Poomsae.
Poomsae Team Size:	Maximum of ten (10) athletes, with a maximum of five (5) athletes per gender subject to the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Individual events: Maximum of one (1) per gender. ▪ Pair events: Maximum of one (1) per gender. ▪ Team events: Maximum of three (3) athletes per gender. ▪ Each athlete may compete in both Poomsae and Kyorugi.
Team Kyorugi:	The Kyorugi Team competition will be organized as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Male and female teams composed of three (3) athletes per gender respectively. ▪ Mixed team composed of four (4) athletes, with two (2) per gender. ▪ Athletes may only participate on one (1) Kyorugi Team. ▪ Teams shall be composed of athletes selected within the sixteen (16) Kyorugi and ten (10) Poomsae athletes already participating at the event.
Team Leader:	Taekwondo Canada may nominate a Team Leader acting as the team manager.
Team Coaches:	Maximum of four (4) coaches for Kyorugi and two (2) coaches for Poomsae, subject to the number of athletes confirmed to participate at the event.
Head Coach:	A Head Coach may be appointed.
Selection Event:	2025 Taekwondo Canada Senior Kyorugi National Championships and Team Selections (hereby referred to as the “2025 Senior Team Selection Event”).
Responsibilities:	Taekwondo Canada is responsible for developing and approving the Selection Criteria for the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games. All team nominations, including alternates (if applicable) and staff, will be ratified by the High Performance Director (HPD). The HPD is responsible for ensuring that the process outlined in this document is properly followed and that the selection process is fair and equitable for all candidates.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 **Purpose:** The purpose of this Selection Criteria is to select individuals for nomination to U SPORTS for the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games.
- 1.2 **Objective:** The objective of the Selection Criteria is to outline a clear and fair process that describes how athletes are identified and selected for nomination to the national team competing at the 2025 FISU Summer University Games.
- 1.3 **Participation of Taekwondo Canada:** Taekwondo Canada can nominate up to sixteen (16) Kyorugi and ten (10) Poomsae athletes to compete at the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games.

2. DECISION MAKING AUTHORITY

- 2.1 Nominations to Taekwondo Canada’s 2025 FISU Summer World University Games Team will be selected by the HPD.
- 2.2 All Taekwondo Canada nominations are also subject to the approval of the U SPORTS.
- 2.3 The HPD has the final authority over the nomination of the team. After the selection process is completed, if any spots remain unfilled, the HPD has the authority to fill those spots.
- 2.4 If unanticipated circumstances arise that are not covered in the selection criteria, a final and binding decision will be made by the HPD

- 2.5 The HPD will confirm the final team composition for all major championships and Games using the criteria published in this document.
- 2.6 On-site Decision Making Authority:
 - 2.6.1 During the actual competition period onsite at the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games, all final decision making authority will reside with the HPD or designated Team Leader.
 - 2.6.2 If the HPD or designated Team Leader is prevented from exercising their functions for any reason, the authority to make decisions in accordance with this Selection Criteria shall be vested in the Head Coach or named Team Coach until the HPD or designated Team Leader is able to resume their functions.

3. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

At the time of nomination to an event, all athletes seeking nomination to the team must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- 3.1 Only the following may participate as a competitor in the World University Games:
 - 3.1.1 Students who are currently officially registered as proceeding towards a degree or diploma at the university or similar institute whose status is recognized by the appropriate national academic authority of their country;
 - 3.1.2 Former student of the institution mentioned in 3.1.1 who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in the year preceding the event.
- 3.2 Be at least eighteen (18) and no older than twenty-five (25) years of age on December 31st of the year of the event. For the 2025 Summer World University Games, participants must be born between January 1st, 2000 and December 31st, 2007.
- 3.3 Must be a registered participant in good standing with Taekwondo Canada.
- 3.4 Must be a Kukkiwon Dan holder.
- 3.5 Must hold a valid 2025 World Taekwondo Global Athlete License.
- 3.6 Must be eligible to represent Canada at major international events under the eligibility requirements of World Taekwondo (WT), Fédération Internationale du Sport Universitaire (FISU), U SPORT, and Taekwondo Canada.
- 3.7 Athletes must be Canadian citizens to represent Canada at official international events or to compete at national championships.
- 3.8 Have a valid Canadian passport that does not expire prior to February 1, 2026.
- 3.9 Sign, submit, and comply with all entry forms and the required documentation where deadlines are adhered to, as outlined by U SPORTS for submission to the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games Organizing Committee.
- 3.10 Must not be serving a period of ineligibility for an anti-doping rule violation or be under a provisional suspension following the assertion of an anti-doping rule violation by either WT, the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport or any other Anti-Doping Organization.
- 3.11 Must not be serving a period of ineligibility for a code violation or be under a provisional suspension following the assertion of a code violation by the Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner (OSIC) that is responsible for the administration of the Universal Code of Conduct to Prevent and Address Maltreatment in Sport (UCCMS).
- 3.12 Must sign an acknowledgement and consent form and agree to be under the jurisdiction of OSIC and be subject to the terms in the UCCMS for the duration of Taekwondo Canada National Events in which they are participants.
- 3.13 Must not be serving a period of ineligibility for a code violation or be under a provisional suspension following the assertion of a code violation by FISU.
- 3.14 Must sign an Athlete Agreement as required by Taekwondo Canada.

- 3.15 Athletes named to compete in the 2025 Summer World University Games will be required to comply with dress code regulations of Taekwondo Canada and U SPORTS. This will include Official Team Competition Clothing and the Official Team Podium/Parade Clothing.
- 3.16 Athletes named to the 2025 Summer World University Games will only be allowed to use equipment that meets the rules and regulations of WT and/or FISU.
- 3.17 Should any of the eligibility requirements enumerated above change between the time of publication of this document and the time of the event for reasons that are beyond the control of Taekwondo Canada, all athletes will be promptly notified.

4. FISU CRITERIA

- 4.1 The Taekwondo events at the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games will be organized in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of WT.
- 4.2 The programme and duration of the competitions are fixed by FISU in agreement with the Organizing Committee. In principle, the programme will last seven (7) days.
- 4.3 The Kyorugi Weight Classes will be as per the WT Senior World Weight Classes.
- 4.4 The Poomsae competition will utilize the divisions of Male and Female Individual, Mixed Pair, and both Male and Female Three (3) Athlete Teams.
 - 4.4.1 Each athlete shall perform a Recognized and a Freestyle Poomsae in the Final round where the allocation of total points in Finals is 50% Recognized and 50% Freestyle.
 - 4.4.2 Each athlete may compete in more than one category of the Poomsae competition.
- 4.5 Team Kyorugi teams shall be composed of athletes selected within the sixteen (16) Kyorugi and ten (10) Poomsae athletes of each participating delegation in accordance with the following total weight:
 - 4.5.1 Male Team: Total weight 240kg or less.
 - 4.5.2 Female Team: Total weight 200kg or less.
 - 4.5.3 Mixed Team: Total weight of the two (2) male athletes must be 160kg or less, with the total weight of the two (2) female athletes 135kg or less.
- 4.6 Athletes are not allowed to participate in more than one Kyorugi Team competition.
- 4.7 Each athlete may compete in both Kyorugi and Poomsae events.
- 4.8 Drawing for Poomsae, Individual Kyorugi, and Team Kyorugi shall be held immediately following the General Technical Meeting.
 - 4.8.1 Seeding for draws will follow be based on WT World Ranking, according to the guidelines stipulated in the by-laws of WT.

5. TAEKWONDO CANADA ATHLETE SELECTION PROCESS

- 5.1 **Kyorugi**
 - 5.1.1 If eligible, the winner (gold medalist) of each weight class at the *2025 Senior Team Selection Event* will be offered a position for nomination to Taekwondo Canada's 2025 FISU Summer World University Games team.
 - i. If the winner (gold medalist) is not eligible, the second-place finisher (silver medalist) will be offered a position for nomination to Taekwondo Canada's 2025 FISU Summer World University Games team.
 - 5.1.2 Any remaining vacant divisions following nominations from 5.1.1 will remain vacant.
- 5.2 **Individual Poomsae**
 - 5.2.1 For each gender and if eligible, Poomsae athletes that competed in the Individual Recognized and the Individual Freestyle events within the Under 30 and Over 17 divisions respectively at the *2025 Senior Team Selection Event* will be selected for nomination to Taekwondo Canada's 2025 FISU Summer World University Games team based on the following criteria:

- i. The male athlete that competed in the Individual Recognized Under 30 and the Individual Freestyle Over 17 divisions with the highest combined final scores from both divisions will be selected.
 - ii. The female athlete that competed in the Individual Recognized Under 30 and the Individual Freestyle Over 17 divisions with the highest combined final scores from both divisions will be selected.
- 5.2.2 If there is a tie for the highest combined scores for either or both male and female poomsae athlete selections, the following tie-breaking procedure will be used in priority order:
- i. The athlete with the higher final score in the Individual Freestyle Over 17 division will be selected.
 - ii. The athlete with the higher final rank as determined by the event standings in the Individual Freestyle Over 17 division will be selected.
- 5.2.3 If either athlete that is selected for nomination via 5.2.1 is not eligible, the second highest point total athlete will be offered a position for nomination to Taekwondo Canada's 2025 FISU Summer World University Games team
- 5.2.4 Any remaining vacant divisions following nominations from 5.2.1 and 5.2.3 will remain vacant.

5.3 Mixed Pair and Team Poomsae

- 5.3.1 For each gender, Poomsae athletes that competed in the Individual Recognized and the Individual Freestyle events within the Under 30 and Over 17 divisions respectively at the 2025 Senior Team Selection Event will be ranked based on the combined final scores from both divisions.
- 5.3.2 Eligible athletes ranked second (2nd) and third (3rd) will be selected for nomination to Taekwondo Canada's 2025 FISU Summer World University Games team.
- i. Athletes ranked fourth (4th) and fifth (5th) will be named as alternate athletes to replace either or both of the second (2nd) and third (3rd) ranked athletes if they are not eligible to compete at the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games.
- 5.3.3 If there is a tie for the highest combined scores for either or both male and female poomsae athlete rankings, the following tie-breaking procedure will be used in priority order:
- i. The athlete with the higher final score in the Individual Freestyle Over 17 division will be selected.
 - ii. The athlete with the higher final rank as determined by the event standings in the Individual Freestyle Over 17 division will be selected.
- 5.3.4 The Mixed Pair and Team Poomsae teams for the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games will be created from eligible athletes within the identified athlete pool of top five (5) athletes per gender as defined under 5.2, 5.3.1, 5.3.2, and 5.3.3.
- 5.3.5 Any remaining vacant divisions following nominations from 5.3 will remain vacant.

5.4 Event Entry and Vacant Divisions

- 5.4.1 Upon completion of the athlete selection process as outlined through articles 5.1 to 5.3 AND prior to the finalization of event entries, Taekwondo Canada's HPD and appointed Team Coach(es) have the sole discretion to fill vacant divisions using athletes already selected through articles 5.1 to 5.3 AND already nominated to the team.
- 5.4.2 Any necessary changes in athlete specific event entries to fill vacant divisions must still meet the requirements under Sections 3 and 4, as well as the Pair and Team member replacement limitations as outlined under 5.3.2.i.

6. COMPETITIVE READINESS

- 6.1 "Competitive readiness" is defined as the ability of the athlete to achieve equal or superior performance(s) at the scheduled event, as compared to the performance(s) the athlete achieved in qualifying.

- 6.2 Athletes must agree to participate in any Taekwondo Canada designated camps related to this event. Failure to comply will lead to removal from the team.
- 6.3 Athletes who do not remain competitively ready by reason of lack of fitness, injury, or illness may be removed from team based on proximity and dates of competition.
- 6.4 Taekwondo Canada's HPD and the National Team Physician will make the final decision on competitive readiness in concert once the nomination and selection processes are completed. These two individuals will have absolute discretion about which factors they will consider in making their final decision.
- 6.5 Injured or ill athletes may be subject to a proof of readiness to be determined by the HPD and National Team Physician in consultation with the athlete's personal coach. These athletes will not travel with the team until this requirement has been satisfied. Final decisions on the selection of athletes to participate in a specific event shall be made by the HPD.
- 6.6 Injuries or illnesses that occur after the nomination and selection deadlines will be dealt with similarly, and subject to any related FISU and/or U SPORTS policies. If an athlete is injured during the Games, a decision regarding their continued participation at the Games will be made by the HPD, in consultation with the U SPORTS Chief Medical Officer, Taekwondo Canada Team Leader, the Integrated Support Team (IST) member responsible for the sport, and the athlete, and shall be governed by the terms of the Athlete Agreement.

7. LOSS OF NOMINATION STATUS

- 7.1 During the nomination and qualification period, the Decision Making Authority (DMA) as outlined in Section 2 may, at any time, and at their discretion, remove an athlete from the Canadian Team if, after following the relevant and applicable disciplinary process, the athlete has been found to have violated Taekwondo Canada's Code of Conduct. Taekwondo Canada will advise the affected athlete, in writing, of their decision to remove them from the Canadian Team.
- 7.2 Athletes must maintain ongoing eligibility requirements in accordance with Section 3.
- 7.3 Team nomination to U SPORTS is subject to the approval of the U SPORTS Team Selection Committee. Reasons for removal may include, but are not limited to:
 - 7.3.1 Failure to respect any conditions indicated in the signed Taekwondo Canada Athlete Agreement.
 - 7.3.2 Inability to perform due to injury, illness or for other medical reasons as determined by Taekwondo Canada's medical staff and in consultation with U SPORTS Chief Doctor once on-site.
 - 7.3.3 Violation of signed Taekwondo Canada Team Protocols.
 - 7.3.4 Violation of the Taekwondo Canada Code of Conduct as signed in the Taekwondo Canada Athlete Agreement.
 - 7.3.5 Detrimental conduct to the team and/or the image of Taekwondo Canada or the national team program.
 - 7.3.6 Failure to adhere to the anti-doping rules or requirements of any anti-doping organization with authority over the athlete.
- 7.4 After nomination to U SPORTS, the DMA reserves the right to withdraw an athlete's nomination from the Canadian Team:
 - 7.4.1 If the athlete has not taken part in the mandatory training camps organised by Taekwondo Canada prior to the event.
 - 7.4.2 If the athlete has not fulfilled their responsibilities as identified in the Taekwondo Canada Athlete Agreement.
 - 7.4.3 If the athlete has not fulfilled their responsibilities as identified in the Taekwondo Canada Code of Conduct as signed in the Taekwondo Canada Athlete Agreement.
 - 7.4.4 If the athlete has not followed any previously communicated training program and/or competition requirements.
 - 7.4.5 If the athlete fails to respect any other conditions of nomination as specified by Taekwondo Canada at the time of nomination.

- 7.5 After the athlete has been nominated to the Canadian Team, U SPORTS may remove an athlete from the Team if, after following the relevant and applicable disciplinary process, the athlete is found to have violated U SPORTS Code of Conduct, the terms of the U SPORTS Agreement or any other relevant and applicable U SPORTS policy

8. STAFF SELECTION PROCESS

- 8.1 Taekwondo Canada nominated Team Leaders must satisfy the expectations and requirements of U SPORTS.
- 8.2 The HPD has the sole discretion in selecting the support staff including Team Leader and coach(es) for the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games team. The support staff will be selected based on the principle of sending a team of specialists that is best capable of assisting athletes in achieving podium performances at the Games. All selections are subject to U SPORTS approval.
- 8.3 A maximum of four (4) Kyorugi and two (2) Poomsae coaches will be selected, subject to the number of athletes confirmed to participate at the event. Coaches with multiple athletes nominated to the team will be prioritized for coach appointments. Overall team composition and bilingual coaching support will also be considered.
- 8.4 Coach eligibility requirements:
- 8.4.1 Must be 21 years of age or older at the time of the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games.
 - 8.4.2 Must be Performance Coach certified and have a valid Registered Coach or Chartered Professional Coach membership with the Coaching Association of Canada.
 - 8.4.3 Must be a registered participant in good standing with Taekwondo Canada.
 - 8.4.4 Be in compliance with all relevant WT, FISU, and U SPORTS requirements for eligibility.
 - 8.4.5 Have a valid passport that does not expire prior to February 1, 2026.
 - 8.4.6 Sign, submit, and comply with all entry forms and the required documentation where deadlines are adhered to, as outlined by U SPORTS for submission to the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games Organizing Committee
 - 8.4.7 Must hold a valid 2025 World Taekwondo Global License.
 - 8.4.8 Must be eligible to represent Canada at major international events under the eligibility requirements of WT and Taekwondo Canada.
 - 8.4.9 Must not be serving a period of ineligibility for an anti-doping rule violation or be under a provisional suspension following the assertion of an anti-doping rule violation by either WT, the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport or any other Anti-Doping Organization.
 - 8.4.10 Must not be serving a period of ineligibility for a code violation or be under a provisional suspension following the assertion of a code violation by the Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner (OSIC) that is responsible for the administration of the UCCMS.
 - 8.4.11 Must sign an acknowledgement and consent form and agree to be under the jurisdiction of OSIC and be subject to the terms in the UCCMS for the duration of Taekwondo Canada National Events in which they are participants.
 - 8.4.12 Must not be serving a period of ineligibility for a code violation or be under a provisional suspension following the assertion of a code violation by FISU.
 - 8.4.13 Staff named to compete in the 2025 Summer World University Games will be required to comply with dress code regulations of Taekwondo Canada and U SPORTS. This will include Official Team Competition Clothing and the Official Team Podium/Parade Clothing.
 - 8.4.14 Must sign a Coach, Management, and Staff Agreement as required by Taekwondo Canada.
 - 8.4.15 Should any of the eligibility requirements enumerated above change between the time of publication of this document and the time of the event for reasons that are beyond the control of Taekwondo Canada, all coaches will be promptly notified.
 - 8.4.16 Should any of the eligibility requirements enumerated above change between the time of publication of this document and the time of the event for reasons that are beyond the control of Taekwondo Canada, all coaches will be promptly notified.

9. CONFIRMATION OF ENTRIES

- 9.1 By no later than March 16, 2025, Taekwondo Canada shall determine the athletes (and alternate athletes if applicable) it proposes to nominate to U SPORTS positions on the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games team.

10. AMENDMENTS AND UNFORSEEN CIRCUMSTANCES

- 10.1 Any changes to this document shall be communicated directly to all affected parties. This clause shall not be used to justify changes after a competition or trials which formed part of these Selection Criteria unless it is related to an unforeseen circumstance. This is to allow for changes to this document that may become necessary due to a typographical error or a lack of clarity in a definition or wording before it has an impact on athletes. In the event of a change to this document, Taekwondo Canada shall inform U SPORTS of the changes and the reasons for those changes as soon as possible.
- 10.2 In the event of unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of Taekwondo Canada that prevents the HPD from fairly implementing these Selection Criteria as written, Taekwondo Canada's Executive Director (ED) shall have the full discretion to resolve the matter as they see fit, considering factors and circumstances that they deem relevant.
- 10.3 In situations where unforeseen circumstances do not allow the selection process to be fairly and objectively applied, the HPD in consultation with the ED, reserves the right to rule on an appropriate course of action.
- 10.4 The HPD reserves the right to review and modify any selection criteria or decision related to the selection process in the case of rule or policy changes from WT and/or FISU that affect the selection criteria set out in this document. In the event that the selection criteria are modified, Taekwondo Canada will promptly post an announcement on its website announcing the changes.
- 10.5 Further, situations may arise that do not allow the selection criteria to be modified or applied as written due to time constraints or other exceptional or unforeseen circumstances. In such situations, any decision, including selection to teams, will be made by Taekwondo Canada's HPD, in accordance with the selection principles as stated herein. Should it be necessary to make any decision in this manner, Taekwondo Canada will communicate with all affected individuals as soon as possible.
- 10.6 Should it be necessary to cancel or postpone any event specified in this Selection Criteria that is conducted under the authority of Taekwondo Canada, such decision shall be made by the relevant person(s) or body within Taekwondo Canada under whose authority the event was originally to be held.
- 10.6.1 Decisions to cancel or postpone any event specified in this Selection Criteria shall be made:
- i. Only when necessary, such as when it has become impossible or unreasonably difficult to hold the event at all or on the originally scheduled date.
- AND
- ii. As soon as reasonably possible after Taekwondo Canada has become aware that the event cannot be held.
- 10.6.2 If any event specified in this Selection Criteria is canceled, Taekwondo Canada shall determine whether it is feasible to reschedule the event in a different location and on a different date than previously scheduled and shall communicate any such decisions to reschedule the event to all impacted individuals as soon as reasonably possible, taking into account the time needed for athletes to prepare for the rescheduled event and for any logistical matters in relation to the event to be addressed, including, but not limited to, any matters related to Taekwondo Canada's organization of the event, as well as athlete and athlete entourage travel to the location of the rescheduled event.
- 10.6.3 Taekwondo Canada may also determine, at its sole discretion, following consultation with the relevant and necessary individuals and/or committees within Taekwondo Canada's structure, to hold alternative replacement events or assessments for the purpose of nomination to the 2025 FISU World University Games Team, but only where feasible and where the nomination

- procedure indicated in this Selection Criteria, including the stated performance objectives, are not prejudiced.
- 10.6.4 Should any event specified in this Selection Criteria be canceled, postponed, rescheduled or replaced, Taekwondo Canada shall update the nomination procedures indicated in this Selection Criteria, as applicable, as soon as reasonably possible and shall communicate any modifications to all impacted individuals, as well as publish the modified Selection Criteria on its website, prior to the postponed, rescheduled or replacement event.
- 10.6.5 Decisions made pursuant to this clause shall not be subject to appeal and do not apply to the cancellation of events that are conducted under the authority of organizations other than Taekwondo Canada.
- 10.7 Taekwondo Canada recognizes that athletes, athlete entourage and staff may, for safety reasons may decide not to travel to and participate in events indicated in this Selection Criteria that will be used for nomination to the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games team, even in circumstances when the event may proceed as planned, and even when Taekwondo Canada has decided host the event following consultation with medical and public health safety experts, that it is safe to do so.
- 10.7.1 In such circumstances, athletes will be responsible for any impact that their decision may have on their 2025 FISU Summer World University Games qualification, and their ability to obtain nomination to the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games team.

11. APPROVAL AND APPEAL PROCESS

- 11.1 Taekwondo Canada nominations to U SPORTS for the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games may be appealed in accordance with the procedures set out in Taekwondo Canada's Appeal Policy. Any dispute relating to Taekwondo Canada's Selection Criteria for the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games must be brought according to said Policy or may be brought directly to the Sport Dispute Resolution Centre of Canada (SDRCC) with the consent of all parties.
- 11.2 If an appeal is urgent and a decision must be made quickly, both parties may agree to bypass the internal appeal process and have the matter heard directly before the SDRCC.
- 11.3 Internal appeals shall be made in writing to Taekwondo Canada to the attention of the ED. The appeals must follow Taekwondo Canada's appeal procedures in place at the time the team is announced and can be found at: <https://taekwondo-canada.com/wp-content/uploads/2022/04/TC-Policy-Appeal-Revised-March-2022.pdf>.
- 11.4 Appeals must be filed no later than 11:59pm (in the local time zone of the appellant) on February 21st, 2025.
- 11.5 Issues not otherwise addressed by this selection document shall be resolved by the HPD.

12. FUNDING

- 12.1 U SPORTS considers the event to be completely self-funded by the participants and have provided the following estimated costs (subject to change).
- 12.1.1 Travel to Rhine-Rhur \$2,000 CDN
- 12.1.2 U SPORTS Participation Fee \$2,200 CDN
- i. Subject to change.
 - ii. Inclusive of mission staff costs, team outfitting, FISU entry fee, operations/administration costs, on-site logistics, and Team Canada activities.
- 12.1.3 Host Participation Costs \$2,329
- i. Subject to change and will vary based on actual length of stay for each sport.
 - ii. Inclusive of accommodation and meal plan within the Games Village, and ground transportation during the event.
- 12.1.4 Referee Fees \$240
- i. Subject to change based on exchange rates.

- ii. Participants in Taekwondo are required to cover the shared costs of the referees for the event.
- 12.1.5 **Estimate Total Cost per Participant \$6,769 CDN**
- 12.2 Taekwondo Canada will endeavor to provide financial support to cover the costs listed under 12.1 for all selected coaches and staff, subject to the number of athletes confirmed to participate at the event. All other participants will be completely self-funded.
 - 12.2.1 In the event there is insufficient funds available to cover the selected coach and staff costs entirely, the remaining balance of costs will be shared amongst the athlete participants.
- 12.3 Funding for the 2025 FISU Summer World University Games team and any associated mandatory training camps will be dependent on the Taekwondo Canada high performance event budget.
