Management	Taekwondo Canada remains responsible for registrations at the national level. For provincial referee management, registration and tracking must be handled by the province.		
Nb of participants	In order to hold a seminar, a minimum of 15 participants must be planned. This is to cover all costs associated with a seminar <sup>(2)</sup> .		
Proposition of Logistics	<ul> <li>Schedule: <ul> <li>9:00 to 16:30 (if the evaluation of ring management (national referees only) is done the next day during a provincial competition).</li> <li>9:00 to 18:30 (No competition the day after)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Location: Room with tables and chairs for the technical part and maybe the same room (removing tables and chair) for practising hand signals.</li> </ul>
