- Must have a valid 2026 World Taekwondo Global License with event pass
- Must not be serving a period of ineligibility for an anti-doping rule violation or be under a provisional suspension following the assertion of an anti-doping rule violation by either WT, the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport or any other Anti-Doping Organization
- Para Poomsae Athletes must review the World Taekwondo Para Classification Guide and self-identify within a Sport Class

- Must have engaged in Taekwondo's NCCP training and be Assistant Instructor Certified, Dojang Coach Certified or Performance Coach Certified
 - C1 Performance Coach (PC) Certified
 - C2 Dojang Coach (DC) Certified
 - C3 Assistant Instructor (AI) Certified
 - Coaches may only register as a C3 once in a lifetime
- Coaches must have completed their certifications prior to the close of event registration



UNIFORM & EQUIPMENT

- **PSS:** KPNP K2 Protector and Scoring System
 - Protector and Scoring System (Headgear and Chest Protector) will be provided
 - Youth athletes are required to bring their own helmets, only a chest protector will be provided for youth athletes
 - The head protector for cadet athletes will be fitted with a face shield
 - Note: The KPNP K1 sensing socks are not compatible with KPNP K2 PSS
- Uniform: Athletes are required to wear a World Taekwondo recognized kyorugi competition uniform and World Taekwondo recognized protective equipment
 - Doboks will be permitted for youth and cadet athletes
 - A list of recognized brands can be accessed at worldtaekwondo.org/wtpartnerswt/recognize.html
 - Club identification on uniforms will not be permitted, only Canada or Canadian province will be accepted















- Athletes are required to bring their own groin guards, mouthpieces, gloves, KPNP K2 sensing socks and shin and forearm guards for their personal use
- Mats: World Taekwondo recognized mats will be used for this event
- Instant Video Replay (IVR) System will be used

INSPECTION

- Athletes must pass inspection before each match
- Athletes are responsible for monitoring the call screen and reporting to the Inspection Desk on time
- Failure to report to the Inspection Desk at least two (2) matches prior to the athlete's scheduled match may result in disqualification
- Uniforms and all mandatory equipment are required to be worn at the time of inspection
- Athletes receiving medical attention are not considered checked in at the Inspection Desk

WFIGH-IN

GENERAL WEIGH-IN

- General Weigh-In of youth athletes shall take place between 12:00 and 14:00 Atlantic Time on the day before their respective competition day
- General Weigh-In of cadet, junior and senior athletes shall take place between 10:00 and 12:00 Atlantic Time on the day before their respective competition day
- Athletes must weigh-in during their designated weigh-in period
- Athletes may have two attempts to make weight before the end of the weigh-in period
- There will be NO EXEMPTIONS to weigh-in time
- Senior athletes: Weigh-in may be conducted in the nude for senior athletes, if they wish to do so
 - Athletes that are 17 years of age and competing in the Senior division must weigh in with underwear(s). Note: there is no 100 grams allowance for seniors.
- Youth, Cadet and Junior athletes: must be weighed with underwear(s) and 100 grams will be allowed to compensate
- A test scale will be provided one hour prior to General Weigh-in
- Athletes must have photo identification when attending weigh-in
 - Event accreditation can be used as photo identification. Athletes may be asked for additional photo identification (ie. passport, driver's license, school ID, etc.) if their event accreditation photo is outdated.

RANDOM WEIGH-IN

- Random weigh-in of athletes shall take place in the morning of the competition day of their respective weight category
 - Random weigh-in will be conducted with plus 5% tolerance of the athlete's weight category
 - Athletes will have one attempt to make the weight
- There will be no random weigh-in for the following individuals:
 - All Youth and Cadet divisions
 - Junior heavy weight divisions (F+68kg & M+78kg)
 - Senior heavy weight divisions (F+73kg & M+87kg)
- The rate of selection for the random weigh-in shall be determined by the number of contestants in the weight category:
 - More than 32 athletes: 20% of total
 - 17-32 athletes: 6 athletes
 - 9-16 athletes: 4 athletes
 - 5-8 athletes: 2 athletes
 - 4 or below: no random weigh-in

COMPETITION RULES

- The latest published World Taekwondo Poomsae Competition Rules & Interpretation shall be applied
- Poomsae athletes may register in a maximum of three (3) poomsae events
 - Should there be any athletes who qualify more than two (2) divisions for Taekwondo Canada's 2026 Poomsae International Event team(s), the athletes must select the two (2) divisions in which they wish to retain their National Team positions
- Music for Freestyle Poomsae Competition must be provided on a USB at the Technical Meeting
 - Music must not contain lyrics or any political, social, or religious contents that may harm, discriminate or offend others
- World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Competition Rules shall be applied
- Para Poomsae athletes are only permitted to compete in para poomsae events
- Protest Procedure for Poomsae at National Championships is outlined in Appendix B

COMPETITION SYSTEM

Cut off System will be utilized for all poomsae divisions

DURATION OF CONTEST

- Recognized Poomsae: Individual, Pair and Team competitions up to 90 seconds
 - Break time between first poomsae and second poomsae is a minimum of 30 seconds
- Freestyle Poomsae: Individual, Pair and Mixed Team competitions from 90 seconds to 100 seconds
- Para Poomsae: Individual, Pair and Team competitions between 20 to 120 seconds for each poomsae
 - Break time between first poomsae and second poomsae is a minimum of 60 seconds

- Designated Compulsory Poomsae for Youth Para divisions will be the same as Para Cadet Compulsory Poomsae divisions

UNIFORM & EQUIPMENT

PARA CLASSIFICATION

- All Sport Classes designated by World Taekwondo for Athletes in Para Taekwondo Poomsae in the World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Competition Rules (ie. P10, P20, P30, P40, P50, P60, P70) will be offered
- Athletes will self-identify their Sport Class prior to or at the event with Taekwondo Canada's National Para Classifier
- Online registration will be by age, gender and event only, sorting of Sport Class will occur prior to or at the event
 - Age divisions may be combined if the division has fewer than 4 competitors
- Taekwondo Canada's National Para Classifier is available before and during the event to provide guidance to athletes regarding the nature of their impairment, its potential alignment with the World Taekwondo Para Classification System, and the next steps for those wishing to pursue formal international classification
- As eligibility for Para Poomsae at Nationals is based on self-identification, any contested Para Poomsae divisions will not be eligible for National Team selection

- All accredited individuals (athletes, coaches) must FIRST be registered with a valid 2026 World Taekwondo (WT) Global License

 - Athletes: must upload a photo, Kukkiwon certificate and a valid Canadian passport or proof of Canadian citizenship
 - Coaches: must upload a photo and Kukkiwon certificate
 - Ensure that the "Order Global License" checkbox is clicked

- APPENDIX A -

PARTICIPANT AGREEMENT/WAIVER

As a requirement for event registration, I agree to the following terms and conditions:

I declare that I am over the age of 18 years old or I am a parent/guardian of a participant under the age of 18 years old.

- 1. I understand that as a condition of event participation, I must have insurance coverage in the event that I require emergency medical treatment. I may be asked to provide proof of my insurance information to the event organizers as a condition of participation.
- 2. I am fully aware of the risks involved and the degree of fitness required in taking part in this event. I accept that the event organizers and their agents cannot be held responsible for any injury or loss, however caused.
- 3. I have not suffered a concussion for which I have not been medically cleared to compete, or suffered a concussion for which I have not been treated in the last 30 days.
- 4. I agree to allow Taekwondo Canada and their agents to capture myself on still image or video for the purposes of promotion.
- 5. I understand that all fees are NON-REFUNDABLE.
- 6. I understand that all athletes and their clubs are required to register with Taekwondo Canada prior to registration.
- 7. Athletes and coaches must adhere to the policies of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA). I understand that as a participant, I, or my athlete, may be subject to anti-doping testing.
- 8. I have reviewed and understand the anti-doping policies of Taekwondo Canada, WADA and CCES.
- 9. I have reviewed the list of prohibited substances recognized by WADA found on the Prohibited List.
- 10. I understand that if I am an athlete in the CCES National Athlete Pool (NAP) or the CCES/WT Registered Testing Pool (RTP), that I am required to declare a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) for medication used for illness or other medical reasons if the medication is on WADA's 2026 Prohibited List.
- 11. I have reviewed and understand Taekwondo Canada policies, including the Code of Conduct and Ethics and the Universal Code of Conduct to Prevent and Address Maltreatment in Sport (UCCMS). I understand that any prohibited behaviours and/or political demonstrations/statements may result a disqualification of the participant from the event.















- APPENDIX B -

OFFICIAL PROTEST PROCEDURES FOR POOMSAE AT CANADIAN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Composition of the Poomsae Review Panel

- 1.1. The panel shall consist of:
 - 1.1.1. Two (2) certified referees who are not involved in judging the Poomsae competition during the
 - 1.1.2. One (1) Taekwondo Canada representative.

2. Responsibilities of the Poomsae Review Panel

2.1. The panel is responsible for correcting misjudgments based on their decision regarding protests

3. Protest Procedure

- 3.1. If there is an objection to a referee's judgment, the competitor(s) or an event accredited representative of the competitor(s) must:
 - 3.1.1. Complete a Taekwondo Canada Protest Form
 - 3.1.2. Pay a protest fee of \$100 CAD cash to the Organizing Committee
 - 3.1.3. Submit both within 10 minutes after the end of the contested performance to ensure a decision is announced within 30 minutes
- 3.2. Protest Deliberation Process
 - 3.2.1. The panel will first determine if the protest is "Acceptable" or "Unacceptable" for deliberation
 - 3.2.2. If needed, the panel may consult the referee or judges involved in the performance
 - 3.2.3. The panel will review recorded judging results and any relevant visual evidence
 - 3.2.4. After deliberation:
 - 3.2.4.1. If both referee members agree on the outcome (to correct or uphold the official results), the Taekwondo Canada representative will approve the decision
 - 3.2.4.2. If the referee members disagree, the Taekwondo Canada representative will decide which opinion prevails
- 3.3. The panel's decision shall be final, publicly announced, and not subject to further appeal
